



Budapest Artineris is a project dedicated to the promotion of contemporary art and to the creation of a lasting network connecting artists, curators, exhibition venues, associations, institutions, and cultural organizations active in Budapest.

The first edition will take place from 21 to 27 September 2026, bringing contemporary art to the city through exhibitions, open studios, meetings, tours, and a wide range of cultural initiatives.

Budapest Artineris was born from the experience of Rome Art Week, an initiative that has demonstrated over the years how an art week can become much more than an annual event. Alongside exhibitions, open studios, and guided tours, Rome Art Week has developed a permanent platform capable of connecting the various actors of the contemporary art scene, providing them with autonomous tools to present their work, organize initiatives, and maintain a recognizable and accessible presence over time.

Budapest Artineris builds upon and expands this model. It is not limited to offering a week of events, but creates a permanent mapping of the local artistic landscape. Artists, curators, and venues can independently manage their profiles, update their content, organize events and tours, use tools for the automatic generation of promotional graphics, and benefit from a permanent URL that will remain active in future editions.

The event week represents the moment of greatest public visibility, when the city becomes an open route through galleries, artists' studios, foundations, independent spaces, academies, and cultural venues. However, the project continues throughout the year thanks to a platform that preserves and makes accessible the network built over time.

This vision led to the creation of Artineris, an international network dedicated to contemporary art and designed to connect different cities through a shared model based on open participation, permanent tools, participants' autonomy, and the enhancement of local cultural identities. Each city retains its own character and artistic scene while becoming part of a broader network of relationships, opportunities, and exchanges.

Budapest Artineris is an inclusive project. Participation is completely free of charge, and paid events are not allowed. Its goal is to encourage the widest possible collaboration among cultural organizations, removing economic barriers and complementing, rather than competing with, existing initiatives.

For this reason, artists' associations, public and private institutions, foundations, academies, universities, independent spaces, and cultural organizations are invited to actively contribute to the development of the project. Their involvement will be essential in expanding the network, bringing new realities to light, sharing experiences, and making Budapest Artineris a truly representative platform for the city's contemporary art scene.

Budapest Artineris aims to be an open, collaborative, and long-term project: a shared platform through which contemporary art can become increasingly visible, accessible, and interconnected.

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
